

Seven Day Budget Camping Safari

Day One: Tarangire National Park

Depart Arusha at for Tarangire National Park. The drive to Tarangire is approximately two hours. After registering at the gate, game drive for the rest of the day. Exit the park and overnight at Wild Palm Campsite.

Tarangire's wildlife includes elephant, lion, giraffe, and many bird and antelope species.

Day Two: Lake Manyara National Park

After breakfast at Wild Palm Campsite, drive to Lake Manyara National Park. The park is approximately 40 minutes from Wild Palm Campsite. Game drive in Lake Manyara until 6pm. Proceed to Jambo Campsite for dinner and overnight.

Lake Manyara's wildlife includes elephant, baboon, hippo, giraffe, and many antelope and bird species.

Day Three: Lake Manyara to Serengeti National Park

Early morning game drive in Lake Manyara. Transfer to Serengeti National Park after brunch. Drive through the Southern Serengeti before reaching Serengeti National Park. Game drive for the rest of the day, arriving at Seronera Campsite at approximately 5:30pm.

Species commonly seen in the Serengeti ecosystem include wildebeest, cheetah, zebra, lion, giraffe, impala, topi, and leopard. The Serengeti is also home to more than 540 bird species.

Day Four: Serengeti National Park

Spend a full day in Serengeti National Park. Return to Seronera Campsite after your game drive.

Day Five: Serengeti National Park

Spend a full day in Serengeti National Park. Return to Seronera Campsite after your game drive.

Day Six: Serengeti to Ngorongoro Conservation Area

Enjoy the morning in the Serengeti. Transfer to Ngorongoro Conservation Area after the game drive. Arrive at the Crater rim campsite in time for the spectacular sunset. Dinner and overnight at Simba Campsite.

Day Seven: Ngorongoro Crater

Depart the campsite after an early breakfast (or with a breakfast box) for your Crater game drive. Spend several hours on the Crater floor before returning to Arusha.

Resident Crater wildlife includes lion, hyena, elephant, wildebeest, zebra, black rhinoceros, flamingo, hippopotamus, and cheetah.

Note:

As there are no public campsites in the Southern Serengeti, we recommend spending one or two nights at a tented camp during the wildebeest migration (January, February and March).
